# logbook software

mccPILOTLOG is an electronic logbook software used by more than **10,000 pilots** worldwide. The software runs on Windows PC, a Mac version is planned for release Q4-2013.

mccPILOTLOG imports data from nearly 170 airlines worldwide. The following Airline Wizards are available today; <a href="http://www.mccpilotlog.net/airlines.html">http://www.mccpilotlog.net/airlines.html</a>

For British Airways pilots, mccPILOTLOG offers the following Airline Wizards:

#### Crewlink

- on-line connection, retrieving data from <a href="https://crewlink.baplc.com">https://crewlink.baplc.com</a>
- can also run off-line; that is, the pilot downloads his roster as TXT file and the interface will then import that file without connecting to Crewlink

#### • eMaestro

- on-line connection, retrieving data from <a href="https://egprd.baplc.com">https://egprd.baplc.com</a>

## • Sabre Rocade

- on-line connection for BA Cityflyer, retrieving data from <a href="https://bacfrm.baplc.com">https://bacfrm.baplc.com</a>

The wizard retrieves planned and achieved flight data with the sole purpose of auto-filling the pilot's personal logbook.

mccPILOTLOG also offers mobile apps for iPhone, Android, Windows Phone and Blackberry. These apps do **not** link to any airline portal.

### All Other Apps - Statement of Compliance

mccPILOTLOG does not repeatedly poll and does not access the BA systems unattended. The pilot must manually press the **Start** button on the PC software Airline page to initiate the download process. The process runs a single attempt, even in case of unsuccessful login or download.



The software is making an individual and direct connection from the user's personal PC/Mac to the above listed web URLs. Connection is established through the app built-in and hidden browser control (Microsoft Internet Control using the Internet Explorer secure engine).

All data is stored on the user's personal PC/Mac in a local database. The Airline Wizard does not store any user data on third party hardware.

To meet EG801 requirements, the "Remember Password" function is disabled for BA pilots as from this week's software update version 3.4 And the "EG801 Compliant - Computer Misuse Act – only authorized access to this system is permitted" message is displayed on the above Airline page as well as in the Help file.

Note: Pilots can upload a backup of the entire logbook database to the mccCloud server. This backup is encrypted and password protected. The password is unique for each user. The pilot does not know the password, since it is auto-generated by the software through a complex algorithm.

Except for the limited group of users that obtain access, mccCloud is nothing different from any other cloud backup storage service, such as Dropbox, Microsoft Mail, iOS iCloud...
